Spring & Fall Cleanup and S.T.O.P. Days

The Town of Babylon will hold **FREE** Cleanup/Stop Throwing out Pollutant (STOP) Days on **Saturday, April 11th** and **Saturday, October 10th**, rain or shine, from 8:00AM - 2:30PM at the Residential Recycling Center on Field Street in West Babylon.



For the Spring and Fall cleanup days, residents are permitted unlimited free trips with an automobile and one free trip with pickups, vans or trailers (4 feet by 8 feet). These cleanup days are free of charge. Any vehicle larger than a van or pickup truck will not be permitted. No commercial waste is accepted.

Acceptable items include furniture, white goods (such as stoves and dishwashers) and wood products such as fencing, paneling and brush. Unacceptable items include car and boat parts or demolition debris. Wood items must be cut into 4 foot lengths.

Spring and Fall Cleanup Days are also designated S.T.O.P. Collection Days from 8:00 A.M. to 2:30 P.M. This program allows residents to bring household hazardous wastes to the Town of Babylon Residential Recycling Center for safe disposal. Participation in this program is vital to ensure safe drinking water and a healthier environment for the future. Please label all material.




Acceptable Items

- Acids • Aerosol cans • Antifreeze • Automotive fluids/care products • Bug and rodent killers • Cleaning products • Driveway sealer • Fluorescent bulbs • Freon canisters • Full propane cylinders • Gasoline • Granular fertilizer containing insecticide • Oil paints and stains • Liquid chlorine • Mercury containing products • Pesticides/insecticides • Powdered chlorine • Thinners and reducers • Pool chemicals.

Calendar Terms

Daily Garbage Pickup

Households with **Monday & Thursday pickup** will have their regular garbage picked up on days designated Monday and Thursday pickup. Households with **Tuesday & Friday pickup** will have their regular garbage picked up on days designated Tuesday and Friday pickup. Please refer to page 4 for detailed information on general garbage collection. **Please call Encon at (631) 491-3200 if you are unsure of which days your home falls under.**

Weekly Recycling Pickup

Recycling is picked up weekly from households on **Wednesdays**. Recycling pickup alternates every week between glass, metal cans & plastics, and newspaper & cardboard. The icon on each week of the calendar indicates which recyclable materials will be collected that week. Please refer to the next page for detailed information on recycling collection.




Holidays

There is no garbage, recycling or yard waste service on days designated as holidays. Holidays that result in garbage service suspensions are indicated by shaded days on the calendar. There is no garbage collection services on: **New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day**. The pickup schedule during the weeks of these holidays may change so be sure to read your calendar for the special holiday pickup schedules.

Please note that service is only suspended on the seven holidays listed above. Although Town Offices are closed for additional holidays, garbage services still occurs on all other town-observed holidays.

Weekly Yard Waste Pickup

Yard Waste is picked up weekly from households **Monday - Friday**. Yard Waste pickup days are determined by which Yard Waste Zone (YWZ) you live in. Yard Waste is collected on the same days as regular garbage and recyclables but at separate times by separate trucks. Please refer to the next page for detailed information on yard waste collection.

Recycling Collection Information

Residential Recycling Center

The Residential Recycling Center, located at 57 Field Street off of Edison Avenue in West Babylon, is open for drop-off of recyclable materials weekdays from 8AM - 2:30PM. For questions or concerns, please call (631) 249-9346 or (631) 249-9347.

Acceptable Items for Drop-Off:

Plastics, glass, waste oil, car batteries, computer paper, telephone books, rocks, bricks, E-waste/electronics, household batteries, bicycles, junk mail, oil filters, metal/aluminum cans, polystyrene, newspapers, cardboard, concrete, (small pieces), four tires with or without rims, propane tanks and used clothing.

PLEASE NOTE: Greasy pizza boxes can contaminate other recyclables. Please place them in your regular garbage

Glass, Metal Cans & Plastics

When the can/bottle symbol appear on your calendar, Encon will collect **glass, metal cans and plastics** from your curbside in your blue recycling bin or clear plastics bags. Encon cannot collect recycling material from any other type of receptacle.

- RINSE all metal, glass and plastic cans and bottles
- REMOVE caps, lids and wire rings
- FLATTEN plastic bottles to fit more contents

Newspaper & Cardboard

When the newspaper symbol appear on your calendar, Encon will collect properly wrapped **newspapers** from your curbside.

- WRAP newspapers in twine or put them in paper bags
- DO NOT use plastic bags, recycling cans or garbage pails
- BUNDLE & TIE magazines, junk mail and cardboard boxes



White Goods

Encon will pickup white goods on Wednesdays; however, **you must call ahead to reserve pickup.** Call (631) 491-3200, weekdays from 9AM - 4PM and a representative will give you the pickup date. You need to call by Friday for pickup the next Wednesday. Please put the item at the curb in front of your house. **For safety, please remove all doors from refrigerators and freezers.**

White Goods Are: residential refrigerators, washers & dryers, dishwashers, stoves & microwaves, water heaters, air conditioners (no central units), bathtubs, metal desks, metal cabinets, compactors, metal dehumidifiers, cut up oil tanks, aluminum sheds (bundled, tied, under 4' and 50 lbs. or less)

E-Waste/Electronics

Due to new regulations by New York State, **e-waste and electronics will no longer be collected at curbside.** This includes but is not limited to: computers & accessories, televisions, cathode ray tubes, VCRs/DVD Players, personal music players and tablets. To properly dispose of E-Waste, residents may either return the item to the place of purchase, drop them at the recycling center or schedule a pickup. You may also utilize reimbursement programs offered by companies such as Amazon and Gazelle.

Yard Waste Collection Information

General Information

Yard waste is collected separately from garbage by Yard Waste Zone (YWZ) 12 months of the year.

- Yard waste cannot be mixed with garbage
- Do not use cardboard boxes for yard waste
- **Only 10 items may be put out per week**
- Bags of grass and leaves must be under 50lbs.
- Disposal regulations for tree debris (**tree branches less than 4 in. in diameter**) require trimmings must be bundled, securely tied, under 4ft. long and under 50lbs.
- If collected on the same day, please make sure to **separate yard waste from regular garbage** by placing yard waste on one side of your driveway and regular garbage on the other side.
- Dirt, sod and rocks cannot be collected
- Bamboo cannot be picked up with yard waste. It has to be picked up with garbage

When is Your Yard Waste Collected?

In order to increase efficiency and improve safety, yard waste is collected according to Yard Waste Zone (YWZ). Please keep yard waste separated from regular garbage. Yard Waste Zones are broken down into five regions of the town:

- 1** South of Montauk Highway - Monday
- 2** Between Montauk Highway & Sunrise Highway - Tuesday
- 3** Between Sunrise Highway & Southern State Parkway - Wednesday
- 4** Between Southern State Parkway & Long Island Avenue - Thursday
- 5** North of Long Island Avenue or LIRR tracks - Friday

PLEASE NOTE: Yard waste will not be picked up on shaded holidays throughout the calendar. Yard Waste pickup will resume the following week on your scheduled day.



General Collection Information

These requirements are established to ensure the cleanliness of our neighborhoods and the safety of our residents and workers. Please read these guidelines carefully to alleviate confusion. If you still have questions, please call Encon at (631) 491-3200 **BEFORE** you put materials to the curb.

Pickup Information

- Use only standard 32 gallon pails with lids, molded handles and no tie-down straps. No materials can be above the top of the can
- The night before, put items at the curb, within one foot from the street in front of your home
- **Only 6 items may be put out per week**
- Do not store material at the curb. Only put out material that will be collected that day (for example garbage on garbage days, yard waste on yard waste days)
- Multi-family homes should put all material at one spot per house
- Do not mix garbage with yard waste or building material
- Separate garbage bags from bags and bundles under 50lbs
- Do not use the blue recycling cans for garbage or newspapers
- Your material can only be collected from in-front of your house
- Make sure your garbage cans are clear of any parked vehicles. Make sure your materials are not placed at the side of any vehicle
- If your yard waste is picked up on the same day as regular garbage, *please separate at the curb*
- **Still have questions about how to properly put your garbage to the curb? Visit www.townofbabylon.com**

Miscellaneous Information

If cardboard boxes contain garbage, they must be tied securely with rope.

When disposing of barbecue or fireplace ash, be sure it is cold before putting it in a plastic bag and tying it securely for pickup.

Latex (water-based) paint can only be disposed of in your regular garbage if can is less than 25% full and contents are dried out. Fuller cans must be brought to the Residential Recycling Center. **Oil-based paint** cannot be disposed, please bring it to a S.T.O.P Day.

One **passenger** vehicle type tire with or without rim will be picked up on the second pickup day or can be brought to the Residential Recycling Center. The Residential Recycling Center will accept up to 4 tires with or without rims.

Reminder

Excessive amounts of material could result in fines and cleanup costs. Put **ONLY** the material to be collected at the curb. **DO NOT** put material out prior 1:00PM the day before the specific collection.

Unacceptable Items

Encon cannot pickup the following items:

- Propane tanks (you may drop off **empty** 20lb. propane tanks only at the Residential Recycling Center. Other size tanks can be returned to the dealer.)
- Gasoline
- Medical Waste (needles)
- Toxic Material
- Auto & Boat Parts
- Car Batteries
- Ammunition
- Fireworks
- 55-gallon Drums
- Concrete, bricks, stone
- Any commercially generated waste
- **All pool chemicals**
- Liquid paints (see below)



Some of these items can be brought to the Residential Recycling Center. If you need to dispose of any item and are not sure how, please call the Residential Recycling Center at (631) 249-9347.

Limited Construction Debris

Encon will pickup debris - up to two items - on your Thursday or Friday garbage day. Place items at the curb the night before pickup and please follow these instructions:

- **Building material from major renovations cannot be taken**
- Wallpaper, tile, plaster, etc. must be in a container and weigh less than 50lbs.
- Lumber and small diameter pipe must be securely tied in bundles not more than 4 feet in length and less than 50lbs and cannot be over the top of the pail
- Paneling and sheet rock must be in a container or securely tied in bundles no larger than 2 feet x 4 feet and less than 50lbs. Please remove nails from boards to avoid injury
- Put glass in a garbage can or securely wrapped in cardboard marked "glass." **Do not put broken glass in cardboard boxes, plastic bags or blue recycling can**
- 4x4 Railroad Tires will be accepted if they are under 2 feet in length and securely tied in bundles less than 50lbs
- Sawdust will be accepted if it is in a securely tied plastic bag weighing less than 50lbs

Furniture (Bulk Items)

One item of furniture will be taken with each garbage pickup. Furniture is: couches, mattresses and box springs, dressers, one room-size rug (rolled and tied, cut into sections 4' in length and under 50lbs.) Make sure that garbage and furniture are at the same location. **Remember, only one item per garbage pickup.**


Reminder


About the Receiver

A graduate of West Babylon High School and UMass Amherst, Receiver of Taxes Jennifer Montiglio was born and raised right here in the Town of Babylon. Prior to serving as an elected official, she worked in the fashion district for 10 years. She started her own business in 2005 and has now been a small business owner for the last 19 years. In addition to being a small business owner, she is also an active member of the chamber of commerce in her community. She has received numerous awards and recognitions including Women of Distinction three times, 40 under 40 and Business of the Year eight times.

First Elected Tax Receiver in 2019, Jennifer took office in January of 2020 and hit the ground running. Since arriving at Town Hall, she has made significant upgrades to the Tax Office to benefit constituents and make their experience easier. Some changes have included: outside tax collection booths, which allow residents to pay their taxes without leaving their vehicles; adding drop box locations in Town Hall and the Town Hall Annex; and upgrading the online payment portal. She was re-elected in 2023.

Currently, Jennifer and her husband reside in Babylon Village where they are raising their young children. Outside of work Jennifer enjoys spending time with her close-knit family including her parents, older brothers and nieces and nephews. She is also a cheer coach, class mom and a Girl Scout Troop Leader.





Property Tax Information

Property taxes can be paid to the Tax Receiver's Office in Town Hall. First-half taxes are due by Jan. 12th, 2026. Second-half taxes are due by June 1st, 2026. 
